Reducing the cost of property insurance by making transparent how wildfire risk impacts an individual's insurance policy so Colorado property owners can take strategic steps to mitigate that risk, protect their properties from wildfire damage and save money on their property insurance policies (HB25-1182).

Simplifying Subscription Cancellations



Making it easier to cancel subscriptions and trial periods, especially by requiring companies to offer a simple online option, to save Coloradans time and money on cancelling services they no longer want to pay for (SB25-145).
